A Walk Down Memory Lane

This year, I had the opportunity to revisit my childhood. Returning to Wisconsin to see my parents - who downsized from our ancestral home 17 years ago - I swung by the old homestead with my dad and oldest daughter. While stopped in front

of the house, the current owner came out to see what had attracted our interest. Upon hearing that I had grown up in his current residence, he graciously invited us all in for a tour.

Uncertain what to expect, the visit left me with mixed emotions. Originally built by my father in 1952, the only major modification to the home while my parents owned it (other than adding central air as soon as all six children were out of the house) was a small addition in 1975. With the exception of some cosmetic changes by the new owners, it remained virtually unchanged. This provided a great chance for my daughter to experience the home much as it was when I was her age. However, as a remodeling contractor, I struggled with the lack of improvements to the space. (Indeed, the names of my three older brothers remain below the hooks my dad installed over five decades ago to hold their winter coats!)

While I would like to say that my dad's design was timeless, I'm not Elvis and my old home isn't Graceland. Lesson learned: no need to preserve your home for future generations when you can take pictures. My daughter would have been just as happy looking through a photo album of my childhood home as she was about seeing it firsthand.

Twenty Years Later...

This isn't the first time that Jim and Carol Langendorfer called upon Weidmann to remodel their kitchen. Just over twenty years ago, the Langendorfers became the company's first clients when they retained Weidmann to replace their original kitchen. Since then, Weidmann and the Langendorfers have formed a lasting relationship, with the most recent change to their home representing the **sixth** project together.





For this update, the Langendorfers sought a larger island, more storage, and lighter colors overall. Also included on the homeowners' wish list was more natural light in the space. Working with designer, Linda Steenerson, the goals were achieved by combining the existing kitchen, breakfast room, and dining room into a single space. This allowed for both a much larger island and considerably more storage space. With the addition of a larger window over the kitchen sink, more artificial lighting, and off-white perimeter cabinets, the finished product is brighter both day and night.

Highlights include (i) deep brown leathered granite around the perimeter of the kitchen, which provides contrast to the light cabinets while also hiding fingerprints and water spots; (ii) custom inset cabinetry by Timberland Cabinets, (iii) and a design that accommodates Jim's cooking utensils, hides appliances, and provides plenty of seating. Additional storage space was created with stand alone cabinetry outside the kitchen work area. This included a custom walnut hutch inspired by a visit to a furniture showroom. Embellished with German seeded glass doors, beadboard backing and granite top, it is a focal point of the new space.

After enjoying their last Weidmann kitchen for over two decades, the homeowners look forward to the same experience in the new, grander space created with their latest project.
